GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. G-

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING § 50.09 GARBAGE USER FEE OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA, CODE OF ORDINANCES.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA;

SECTION 1. That §50.09 GARBAGE USER FEE of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, is hereby amended as follows:

§50.09 GARBAGE USER FEE

(M) The monthly single-family residential household fee shall be ADD: increased to a rate of \$15.60 per month, effective July 1, 2023. The monthly multifamily two-to-four residential unit household fee shall be increased to a rate of \$31.20 per month (twice the single rate), effective July 1, 2023. For all future rate increases, the multi-family rate will be twice the single-family residential household Effective January 1, 2024, the full single-family residential rate per month. household rate of \$18.60 will be adjusted by the annual change (May to May) in the Consumer Rate Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) expenditure category Series ID: CUUR0000SEHG - water, sewer and trash collection services, as published by the Department of Labor Bureau of Statistics, along with a minimum adjustment of 3% to be applied to the prior year budget/rate. An additional 1% will then be added to ensure a balance in the Solid Waste Fund. Another multiplier will be added if the CPI-U is higher than 3.5% from the prior 6 months. (See Table A for full calculation scenarios). Once that is established, the rate will be adjusted annually on July 1, by the annual change (May to May) in the Consumer Rate Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) expenditure category Series ID:

CUUR0000SEHG - water, sewer and trash collection services, as published by the Department of Labor Bureau of Statistics, along with a minimum adjustment of 3% to be applied to the prior year budget/rate. An additional 1% will then be added to ensure a balance in the Solid Waste Fund.

§ 50.09 GARBAGE USER FEE.

- (A) The solid waste user fee shall be adjusted to a monthly rate of \$7.20 beginning July 1, 1998.
- (B) The monthly single family residential household fee shall be \$9.75 per month, effective October 1, 2004.
- (C) The monthly two-to-four unit household fee shall be \$19.50 per month, effective October 1, 2004.
- (D) The monthly single family residential household fee shall be increased to \$11.24, effective January 1, 2008.
- (E) The monthly two-to-four unit household fee shall be increased to \$22.48 per month, effective January 1, 2008.
- (F) The monthly single family residential household fee shall be lowered to \$11 per month, effective January 1, 2011.
- (G) The monthly two-to-four unit household fee shall be lowered to \$22 per month, effective January 1, 2011.
- (H) Residents that choose to rent additional 96-gallon or 48-gallon carts will be assessed a \$2.00 per month fee per cart on their city utility bill.
- (I) The monthly single-family residential household fee shall be \$9.95 per month, effective September 1, 2011.
- (J) The monthly multi-family two-to-four residential unit household fee shall be \$19.90 per month, effective September 1, 2011.
- (K) The monthly single family residential household fee shall be increased to \$12 per month, effective January 1, 2018.
- (L) The monthly multi-family two-to-four residential unit household fee shall be \$24 per month, effective January 1, 2018.
- (M) The monthly single-family residential household fee shall be increased to a rate of \$15.60 per month, effective July 1, 2023. The monthly multi-family two-to-four residential unit household fee shall be increased to a rate of \$31.20 per month (twice the single rate), effective July 1, 2023. For all future rate increases, the multi-family rate will be twice the single-family residential household rate per month.
