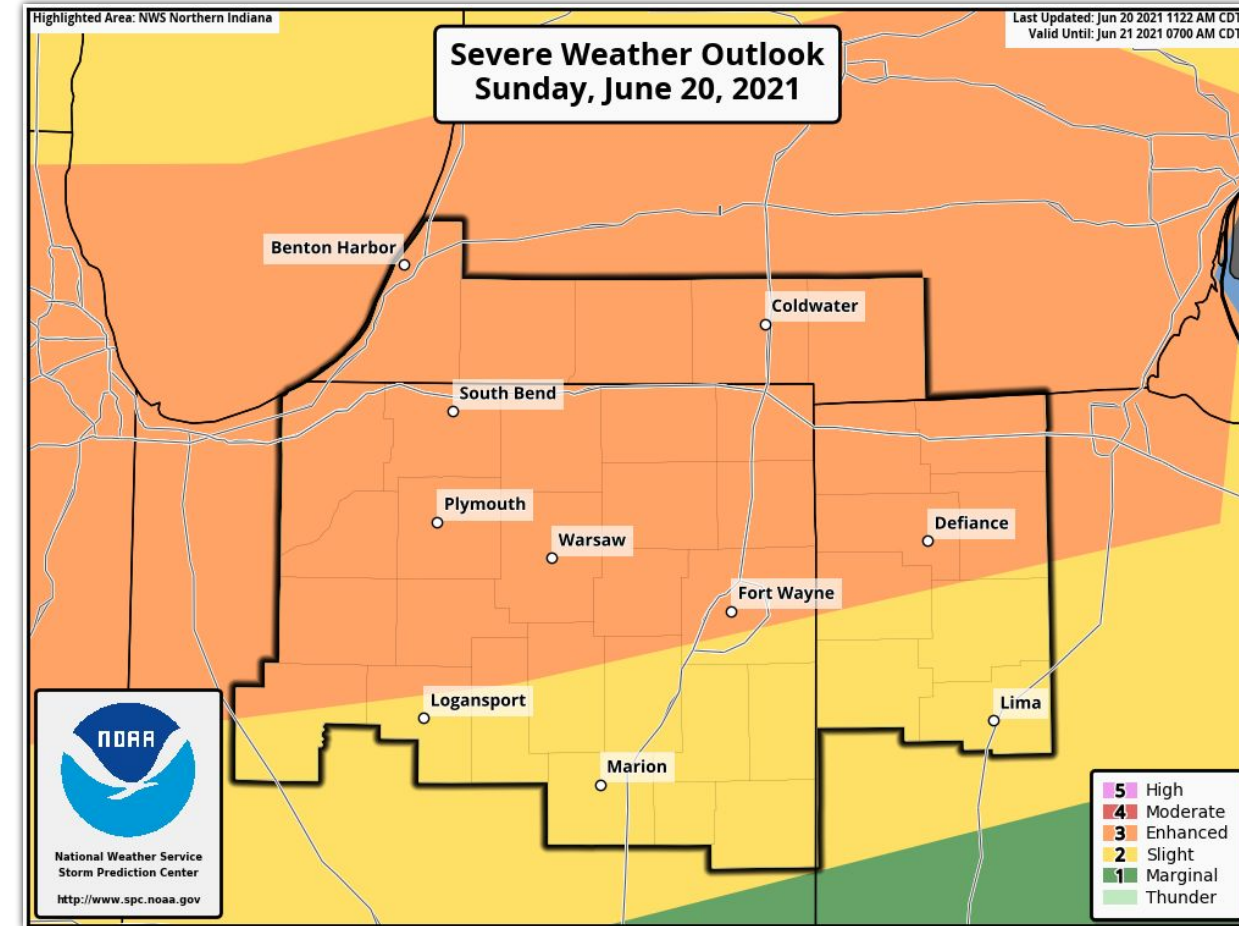
Enhanced to Slight Risk of Severe Thunderstorms

Key Messages

- **Forecast Confidence: High**
 - ◆ High confidence in severe weather occurring
- **Potential Hazards**
 - ◆ All hazards are on the table, including damaging winds, large hail, and tornadoes.
 - ◆ Localized flooding is possible in locations that are under repeated thunderstorms

Severe Weather this Evening

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This Evening's Hazards

What

- Severe thunderstorms are expected this evening

Where

- The greatest coverage of severe storms is expected to be in the **ENHANCED** outlook area
- Otherwise, the entire area is at risk for a severe thunderstorm

When

- **Start:** Storms develop 5PM-8PM EDT, moving W to E, and from SW to NE
- **End:** 10PM-1AM EDT severe storms gradually diminish W to E

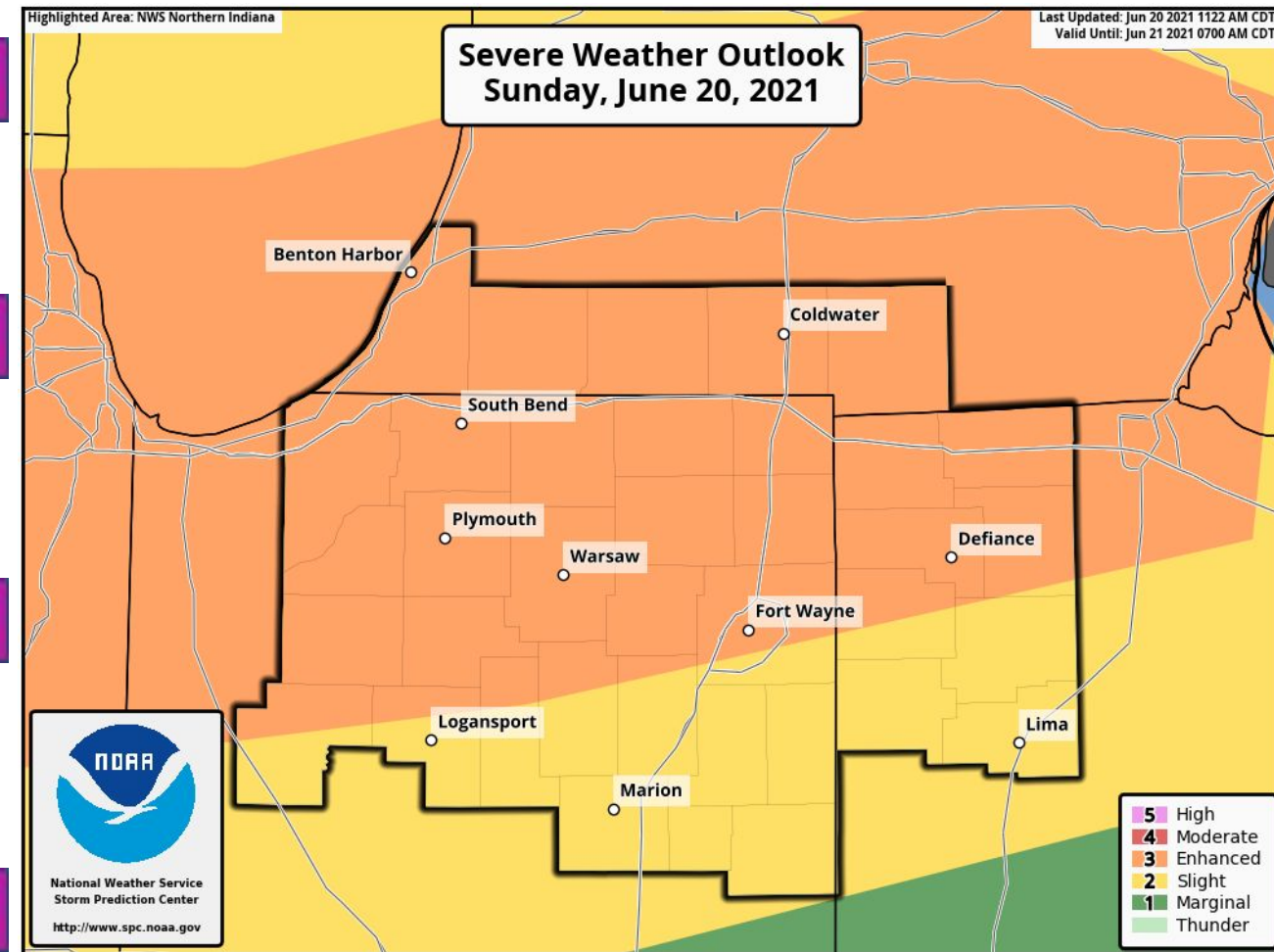

Cold Front Moves Through

What

- A line of showers and thunderstorms may move through early Monday morning
- Line is expected to weaken as it moves east

Where

- **Isolated** damaging wind gust **possible** west of IN route 19.

When

- Cold front enters NW Indiana midnight - 2 AM EDT Monday morning

Have Multiple Methods to Receive
NWS Warnings

- WEA (Wireless Emergency Alerts) and Weather Apps
- NOAA Weather Radio
- Outdoor Sirens
- Life Saving Weather Information
- Family, Friends or Coworkers
- Internet
- Local TV and Radio



Do you have a way to receive watches and warnings?

Severe Thunderstorms this Evening

- Greatest severe risk is with storms starting near 5PM-8PM EDT. All hazards possible.
- Have multiple methods to receive NWS warnings
- Second round of showers/storms possible near 2AM and later; Isolated damaging wind gust possible in the west with that.

- NW wind 10-20 mph, gusts 25 mph
- **HIGH SWIM RISK** at Lake Michigan Beaches
