

## Flood Threat into Monday

Thunderstorms and heavy rain can result in minor flooding

## **Key Messages**

- → Flood Watch through Monday morning
- → Marginal severe weather risk southwest of U.S. 30
- → 2 to 3 inches of rain, 4 inches possible


### **Important Updates**

- → The Flood Watch has been expanded northward into Michigan
- → Potential severe timing extended past midnight, but confidence is low

### **Next Scheduled Briefing**

→ This is the final briefing for this event, unless the forecast changes significantly

#### **Storm Total Rainfall through 8 PM EDT Monday**






# Flood Threat through Monday

Rising water on rivers, creeks, and streams expected

### **River Flooding Possible**

- → Many rivers are forecast to reach Action Stage (yellow points)
- → Several rivers will also experience Minor flooding (orange points) in the Upper Wabash and Kankakee River Basins
- → Monitor river forecasts at water.weather.gov/ahps







## Flood Threat into Monday


#### **Excessive Rainfall Outlook**

#### **Details**

- → Flood watch in effect. See weather.gov/iwx
- → Rain continues through tonight
- Rain, and thunderstorms, may be heavy at times
- → 2 to 3 inches of rain, 4 inches possible

### **About this Map**

- → The Excessive Rainfall Outlook forecasts the probability that rainfall will exceed flash flood guidance
- → Put another way, this outlook forecasts the probability that rainfall will exceed...
  - 1 to 1.5 inches in 1 hour
  - 1.5 to 3 inches in 3 hours
  - 2 to 3 inches in 6 hours
- → Flash Flood risk is greatest in the **red** area





## **Severe Thunderstorms Possible**

#### **Confidence** is low


#### **Overview**


If ingredients can come together, severe thunderstorms are *possible* in the marginal risk area (dark green). Timing: 6pm-2am EDT. Confidence is low.

#### **Actions**



Be weather aware and ready to act. Have multiple ways to receive warning information!







# Flood Threat through Tonight

#### **Summary**



**Hazards:** Flooding is the primary weather hazard through tonight. There is a low-confidence risk for severe thunderstorms.



**Areas Impacted:** The heaviest rain is expected mainly south of U.S. 6. The severe thunderstorm risk is greatest in an area from Winamic, to Logansport, to Marion, Indiana.



**Timing & Duration:** Rain, and thunderstorms, are heavy at times this afternoon through tonight. If conditions are right, severe thunderstorms are possible from about 6pm-11pm EDT today. Rain exits by Monday night.



**Impacts:** Heavy rain will result in rising water on rivers, creeks, and streams. Low-lying and urban areas and can experience flooding.



**Certainty & Considerations:** Confidence is high for heavy rainfall to occur. Confidence is low for severe thunderstorms to occur.



**Historical Perspective:** Unlike the 2 to 4 inches of rain that occurred in late September, our soils are wetter which will increase the flood threat.

**Next Update:** This is Last scheduled briefing for this event unless the forecast changes significantly.
