 - Lower confidence with second part of storm Thursday



Rain changes to snow from northwest to southeast


Brief sleet/freezing rain possible during transition

Strong winds from the north-northeast will lead to blowing and drifting Wed night into Thursday



Two Rounds Heavy Snow Possible - Late Tuesday Night/Wednesday - Additional Thursday

- **Forecast snow accumulations late Tuesday** \rightarrow night through Wednesday night of 8 to 14 inches, lesser south of US 24
- Lower amounts across far NE Indiana/NW \rightarrow Ohio
- This round will be a heavy/wet snow \rightarrow
- **Small changes in storm track will require** \rightarrow adjustments to Tuesday night - Wednesday night snowfall forecast
- Another round of heavy snow possible on \rightarrow Thursday, but confidence in snow amounts and locations is lower




Forecast Snowfall - Late Tuesday Night through Wednesday Night

Probability of \geq 8 Inches



Additional Snowfall Possible Thursday

- Much uncertainty regarding heavy snowfall \rightarrow potential Thursday
- Heavy snow possible along and southeast of \rightarrow **US 24 corridor**
- This round will be a "fluffier"/drier snow, more \rightarrow prone to blowing and drifting



Expected Snowfall Thursday Low Confidence



Significant Blowing and Drifting Snow Likely Wednesday Night Through Thursday

- Peak winds 30 to 35 mph \rightarrow
- **East/West roads most impacted** \rightarrow
- Blowing and drifting especially in rural \rightarrow and open areas
- Whiteout conditions at times




Maximum Wind Gusts Thursday

Small change to storm track will lead to major implications as to:

- Where the heaviest snow will fall 1)
- The extent of the potential of any freezing rain/sleet 2)
- **Degree of blowing/drifting snow** 3)
- Strength of latter part of storm on Thursday 4)

Regardless of final snow/ice amounts, a large area will have significant travel impacts for an extended duration

Get the weather forecast.

Change your travel plans if hazardous weather is expected.

BEFORE YOU GO

Check road conditions.

Call 511 or visit your state's DOT webpage to check on road conditions. Choose a different route or adjust your travel plans if road conditions are poor.

Pack an emergency supply kit.

Stock your vehicle with a mobile phone, charger, batteries, blankets, flashlight, first-aid kit, high-calorie, non-perishable food, candle to melt snow for drinking water, sack of sand or cat litter for traction, shovel, scraper, and battery booster cables.





Ready your vehicle.

Check your battery, wipers, coolant, and other systems affected by cold temperature. Make sure your tires have good tread. Clear snow, ice or dirt from your windows, lights and camera.

WINTER STORM WATCH

A Winter Storm Watch is issued when heavy snow, sleet, or freezing rain is possible.

Be prepared to adjust travel plans in case a Warning is issued.

WINTER STORM WARNING

A Winter Storm Warning is issued when heavy snow, sleet, or freezing rain is expected.

Travel will become dangerous. Delay or adjust travel plans until conditions improve.
